55% want immigration levels reduced, highest since 2001

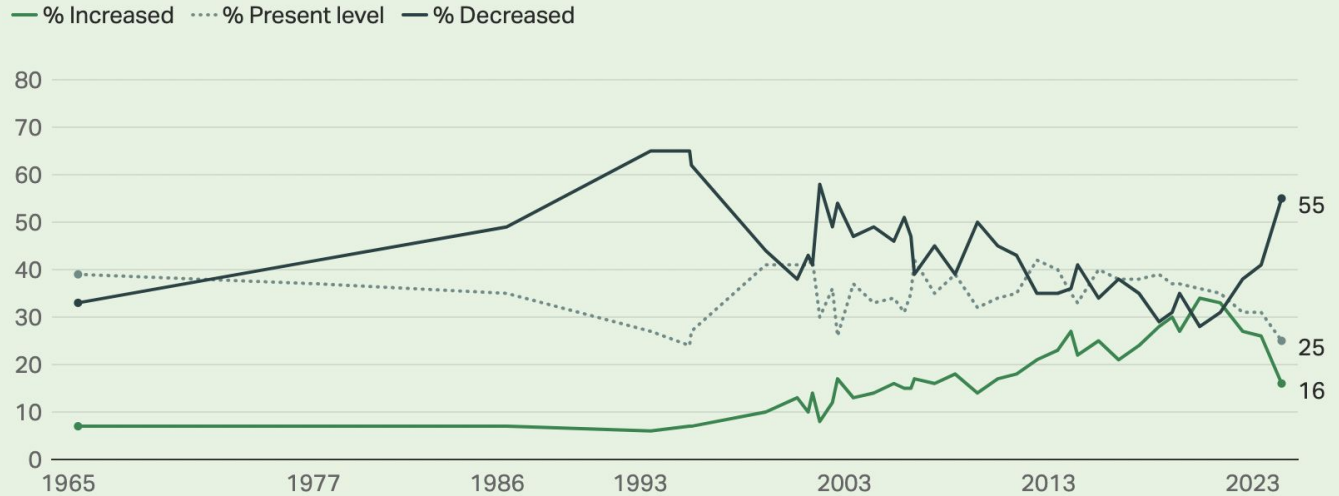
